Life-size bronze; Army and Navy military service members stand guard over the historic monument dedicated to all past, present and future veterans of Claude Sims American Legion Post #68, Brinkley, Arkansas. Claude Sims, was a veteran originally from the Brinkley area, who fought during World War I and was killed and buried in France.

Made of bronze and Georgian granite, the monument stands 9' high by 13' long and contains a central monolith with 2 bronze tablets accommodating approximately 600 names of honored veterans.

The historic town of Brinkley was originally founded from a 1852 land grant and is located half way between Little Rock and Memphis. It is adjacent to the Louisiana Purchase Historic Park and contains several buildings on the National Historical Registry. The monument is located on Cypress St, originally part of the historic Broadway of America Highway.

Internationally acclaimed sculptor, Roy W. Butler, designed and created the early circa WW II representation life-size bronze sculptures utilizing techniques which depict hi-realism authentic detail.
